**Online Learning Technical Stuff** 

We are now in a position to suggest some things that work better than others for online jazz education. This pamphlet provides guidance for an optimal and musical learning experience. If possible, don't be overwhelmed!

### The Basics

- 1. MOST IMPORTANT of all **Sound and video-check** in advance. Make sure you can hear yourself and your computer clearly and that you are comfortable.
- 2. Download the **Zoom** app (aka the **Zoom** "Client") for your computer www.zoom.us
- 3. The optimal microphone position for you and your instrument/voice.
- 4. the optimal sight line so we can see each other.
- 5. iReal Pro as accompaniment. Make sure that the amplification is loud enough. It is possible to run this through directly through **Zoom** once you understand Screen Sharing. In the short term, make sure you can take a line out from your computer to an amplifier or Boom/Amazon Alexa etc. See below.
- 6. Be patient!




# **Set-ups:**

- minimum amount of equipment, basic principles. Works well with a little 1. Entry Level preparation. Most convenient.
- 2. **Intermediate** a few add-ons for a better sound. Slightly inconvenient!
- 3. **Semi-pro** some preparation required but with obvious improvements. Might require some patience!

## 1. Entry Level

- Computer audio and video, computer's own webcam.
- Computer's internal mic.
- Audio via headphones or speakers. UE Boom, Amazon Alexa etc are good. Speakers connect via lead or Bluetooth.
- The computer mic "hears" and transmit a playalong track from the speaker + you.
- Use "Original Sound" on Zoom. See this short video for best audio settings.

### Pros

Less to go wrong!

### Cons

Variable sound quality.

#### You will need to:

- Find the best place to sit or stand in order to be heard.
- Be able to hear clearly.

### 2. Intermediate

As above +

- **External mic** i.e. USB mic (*Blue Yeti* is excellent). www.amazon.co.uk/s?k=usb+mic&ref=nb sb noss
- Webcam i.e. Logitec webcam.
- Connect to HiFi amp/speakers or computer monitors.

### Pros


Better quality audio and video

#### Cons

More links in the chain can cause problems.

### You will need to:

- Work out best place to position mic.
- Be able to hear clearly. Consider connecting computer to laptop or using headphones.



# 3. Semi-pro

### As above +

- Professional mic (i.e. Shure SM58) you will need an Audio Interface (converts audio into digital info).
- Loopback (optional) https://rogueamoeba.com/loopback enables you to use multiple sources of audio on your computer simultaneously.
- Webcam
- Investigate on YouTube. There are many ingenious setups.

### **Pros**

Better quality sound; can accommodate more instruments (i.e. digital piano, guitar etc).

#### Cons

Will require a little thought in order to set up.


### You will need to:

Be patient in setting up but the results are worthwhile.



- Work out best place to position mic.

### **Software**



- **Zoom** app (aka the **Zoom** "Client") for your computer www.zoom.us
- iReal Pro as accompaniment. Make sure that the amplification is loud enough. It is possible to run this through directly through **Zoom** once you understand *Screen Sharing*.
- Loopback https://rogueamoeba.com/loopback enables you to use multiple sources of audio on your computer simultaneously.

# **Sharing Audio and Video on ZOOM**

For when you want to stream (broadcast) audio from your computer to a meeting.

- This is very easy on **ZOOM** as follows: 1) Enter your meeting.
- 2) Click on the GREEN button "Share Screen".
- 3) Click on Advanced.
- 4) Click on "Computer Sound Only". This streams the sound from your computer to the meeting. For example, you can play YouTube videos and everyone can see and hear clearly.
